2008/2009 Pilot Project Competition

Three CANNeCTIN pilot projects were approved in October 2008:

 "Perioperative Ischemic Evaluation-2 (POISE-2) Trial (Perioperative Working Group)"

- "IMPI: Investigation of the Management of Pericarditis (Developing Countries WG)"
- "Understanding the Increased Cardiovascular Risk after Preeclampsia/Eclampsia" (Prevention WG).

Pilot projects submitted in December 2008 are currently under review with results to be announced in February 2009.
