

Denis Xavier, Professor and Head, Department of Pharmacology and Coordinator, Division of Clinical Trials, St. John's Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore, India. He completed MBBS and MD from St. John's Medical College, Bangalore and Masters in Clinical Epidemiology & Biostatistics from McMaster University, Canada. Xavier (with Pais) set up the Clinical Trials Unit at St. John's and

developed collaboration in about 180 Hospitals. This collaboration has or is conducting 34 observational studies in CVD and large clinical trials evaluating different drugs including polypills and the impact of non-medical health workers in prevention of CVD. This collaboration has for 12 years recruited about 60,000 patients with plans to recruit over 50,000. Xavier is the lead author of the CREATE-ACS Registry paper (Lancet-2008) on over 20,000 Acute Coronary Syndrome patients from 89 hospitals in India. He is the *Project Director* and coauthor of TIPS - the first large Polypill trial (Lancet-2009) and **Co-Investigator**, Wellcome Trust Polypill trial (TIPS-3; 5 years, 5-8000 patients). He is the PI of the NIH-UH Center of Excellence at St. John's (NHLBI-UnitedHealth 5-year program) to counter chronic diseases in developing countries. This includes three knowledge translational studies and training programs in health research. Xavier is the **PI** of **AMEND** (research and quality improvement initiatives in CVD), Pfizer Preferred Research Center (to promote clinical research in India) and the Fogarty International Clinical Research Center. He has about 50 publications in Journals such as the Lancet, New England Journal of Medicine, JAMA, Circulation, European Heart Journal, Heart, Nature Cardiovascular, Indian Heart Journal etc. He is a *reviewer* for the Lancet, European Heart Journal, Translational Medicine and the Journal of Experimental Biology and is on the scientific review panel of the Indian Council of Medical Research and the Drugs Controller General of India.
